



## Multnomah County Animal Services June 2020 Monthly Report

**The Multnomah County Animal Shelter (MCAS) accepted 304 animals in June 2020.** The majority of intakes were officer impounded animals, and strays from members of the public. Dogs and cats were the most commonly accepted animals.
