



## Multnomah County Animal Services May 2020 Monthly Report

**The Multnomah County Animal Shelter (MCAS) accepted 291 animals in May 2020.** The majority of intakes were officer impounded animals, and strays from members of the public. Dogs and cats were the most commonly accepted animals.

The Multnomah County Animal Shelter released **256** animals. The majority of these animals were reclaimed by their owners, or transferred to other agencies. Dogs and cats were the most commonly released animals.
